3. About Tarun Chetna:

3.1 Brief Background and Emergence:

Tarun Chetna is a voluntary development organization established in 1993, with the prime objective to ameliorate standard of life of poorest communities, especially of marginalized women & children in Pratapgarh district, Uttar Pradesh India. Pratapgarh comes among 100 most back-warded districts as well as poorest district of India as per identification of planning commission of India (NITI Aayog). Therefore, founder members of Tarun Chetna decided to begin charity at their home.

Tarun Chetna was formed by a group of youths who were strongly influenced by the principles of Mahatma Gandhi Ji, who used to believe in equality and social justice. At present, Tarun Chetna expanded his work in 2 districts (Pratapgarh and Jaunpur) of Uttar Pradesh in India and established remarkable models regarding livelihood, health & education, by which thousands of families taking benefits from the interventions. Tarun Chetna also won national as well as international award for its effective implementation & for extra-ordinary performance.

TCS works to improve the life situation of marginalized community of society and enhancing capacity of civil society individuals as well as civil society organizations for catalyzing development actions in underdeveloped regions. We work mainly with the most marginalized communities with the focus of women to empower them to realize their human rights enhance livelihood and access primary healthcare services for herself and her children and thereby improve their living condition

Since its inception, Tarun Chetna has been engaged bringing positive changes among marginalized communities through capacitating to grassroots level civil society organizations on organizational development issues and on different thematic issues. Our approach and focus has been to create lasting impact on marginalized communities through the intervention of grassroots level CBOs. We have started to work with communities of underdeveloped region through direct intervention of Tarun Chetna. It will help to us to understand the grassroots conditions, real need and to create region & issue specific community development model; their extension & replication can be at larger level through several program as direct interventions.

4. Program Summary:

4.1 Promoting Child Rights mechanism for Holistic Development:

According to Census 2011 information the location code or village code of Bahuta village is 159342. Bahuta village is located in Patti tehsil of Pratapgarh district in Uttar Pradesh, India. It is situated 7km away from sub-district headquarter Patti (tehsildar office) and 35km away from district headquarter Pratapgarh and 198 KM from State capital Lucknow. As per 2009 stats, Bahuta is the gram panchayat of Bahuta village. Bahuta Gram Panchayat have 04 different hamlets named 1- **Kurmiyan-Verma Basti**, 2- **Camarouti-Dalit basti**, 3- **Jolahati-Muslim Basti** and 4- **Bhataan – Brahamin Basti**.



In Bahuta gram panchayats, people have very less landholding. Here the families of Dalit or Muslim community are either marginal farmers or agricultural laborers. Most of the people of the Dalit community work as daily wage workers while the people of the Muslim community migrate to cities like Mumbai and Surat in search of their livelihood and work as weavers in textile mills. More than 50 percent of the people of this village live below the poverty line. In order to increase the income of the family, the people of the Muslim community leave their children in the middle of their studies and send them to work as laborers in Bhiwandi etc. cities.

As per census 2021, the total geographical area of village is 240.37 hectares. Bahuta has a total population of 2,880 peoples, out of which male population is 1,394 while female population is 1,486. Literacy rate of Bahuta village is 61.15% out of which 70.23% males and 52.62% females are literate. There are about 430 house hold families in Bahuta village. Population distribution of Bahuta is 35% Muslims, 25% Dalit, 25% OBC and 15% General population. According to 2% population growth per year Bahuta's population becomes 3398 approximately.

In this situation Tarun Chetna started a Child Rights project named "Holistic development of children in safe, secure and unprejudiced environment." In Bahuta Gram Panchayat as pilot project.

4.1.1- Key intervention in this project during 03 years:

1. Establishing well-functioning eight learning centers equipped with library, sports equipment, music instruments and science and mathematics games, in four villages of Bahuta Gram Panchayat of Patti Block in Pratapgarh District.
2. Establishing and promoting 04 child collectives Bal sansad of the age group 6-14 and motivating them to regularly participate in reading, sports, drama, music, games, science and math activities at learning centers.
3. Awareness Generation among 498 children of the age group 6-14 on child rights, child marriage, child labour, child sexual abuse, child trafficking and motivate them to become monitoring & reporting agents to curb these social abuses through awareness campaign, drama/street play and annual function.
4. Facilitating interface of children's collectives with the existing state institutions and systems to address issues of school dropout, child malnutrition, child marriage, child labour and child sexual abuse. Interface meeting will be organized in 06 monthly basis with SMC/VHSNC members and AHTU/DCPU also.



4.1.2- Key Measurable effects:

1. Eight learning centres are established and successfully functioning in four villages of Bahuta Panchayat of Patti Block in Pratapgarh District.
2. All the child members of eight child collectives are regularly participating in activities at learning centres and there are decreased cases of discrimination and child conflict due to increased awareness among children on social harmony, life's skills, gender, discrimination and diversity.
3. Increased awareness among children and community cadre on child rights, child marriage, child labour, child sexual abuse, child trafficking, Children and

community cadre become monitoring & reporting agents to curb the social abuses and evils.

4. Increased awareness among children on social harmony, environmental degradation, caste and gender discrimination and many children become change agents in promotion of these values among their family as well as community.
5. Interface of children's collectives with the existing state institutions and systems has resulted in decreased number of school dropout and reduced malnutrition among children and increased reporting and rescue of cases of child marriage, child labour and child sexual abuse.

As per above plan, Tarun Chetna established the 08 CLC- Children Learning Centers with library books and sport items, in which 427 children comes daily for 02 hours.

4.1.3- Achievement of Project during FY 2024-25:

- To make the project successful, various training and exposure visits were conducted to enhance the skills of the project staff and children associated with the project.
- 08 child development centres were established under the project, with 419 children associated with them.
- 83 drop out children were enrolled in various schools. Fees of 04 very poor children were waived by lessoning with the school management.
- During the operation of the project, no child marriage has taken place in the entire Gram Panchayat.
- 01 child marriage was stopped by the child parliament member, Defense Minister Mohit Kumar.
- 25 child labourers were freed from child labour.
- 202 children became aware of child marriage, child labour force and exploitation and good touch by touch.
- 155 children started complaining about child labour, child marriage and



- exploitation, good touch-Bad touch.
- 398 children associated with the center started participating in various games and drama street plays.
- VCPC, VHSNC & SMC meetings which were not held regularly started taking place.
- Stakeholders and parents Sensitized on child rights.
- Information on child rights was provided by monthly meetings of parents of children associated with the child development center.
- Stake holders and departments addressed on child rights.
- Newspapers and other social media started publishing news giving importance to child rights programmers.

4.2- JDF-Pre-School Nutrition and Education Centers:

4.2.1- Conducting Pre-school Nutrition and Education Center:

With prime objective, provision of daily Education and Nutrition to malnourished children from 6 months to 5 years in the villages of intervention area, Tarun Chetna has been running Pre School Nutrition and Education Centers in 4 Musahar / Jogi hamlets of Pratapgarh district since 2023, Ramaipur Nevada of Aspur Devsara block and Ramaipur Dishini, Kanja Sarai Gulaami and Dhidhui Gram Panchayat of Patti block.

A total of 125 children in the age group of 0-5 are enrolled at these 04 centers, which are given a glass of hot milk and one packet of biscuits daily by the instructors appointed by the organization. Apart from



this, these children are taught alphabets and numbers by joyful learning way through pre-school education for 02 hours every day.

Along with this, the children enrolled at these centers run with the help of Jiv Daya Foundation are given good quality school dress twice a year and once a year a warm sweater to protect from cold and

a solar lamp to read at night. Apart from this, these children are also given ration kits

twice a year. From time to time, Dabur fruit juice and Chyawanprash are also distributed to these children.

Similarly, pre-school nutrition and education centers have also been opened by the organization in Musahar hamlets Ramaipur Dishini, Kanja Sarai Ghulami, Didhui and Ramaipur Newada in Jogi basti. Discussing about the program, Tarun Chetna Director Mr. Masim Ansari said that with the help of Jeev Daya Foundation formed by a Jain family of Indian origin settled in America. All children must be provided with 2 pair of Clothes, Shoes and Steel Glass within 1 month of Project starting as per ideal system.

Due to these interventions of the organization, the nutrition and hygiene of these enrolled children of Musahar and Jogi communities has improved a lot. Disability of many children has also reduced.

4.2.2- Book- Bag & Solar Lamp Distribution:

Tarun Chetna, with the help of Jeev Daya Foundation, provided 110 copies, books – school bags and 25 Solar Lamps to poor and helpless children. Mr. Laxmikant Sengar, Police Station Incharge Prithviganj (Patti) praised the work of Tarun Chetna and said that serving the children of the poor is true patriotism. While distributing school bags, copies, books, slates, pencils to all the children of the Nutrition Center, he said that education is a human right for every child. It is the foundation of a better society. And plays an important role in the development of a person. Prosperity, development, and scientific progress in society is possible only through education. It is noteworthy



that moving from malnutrition to nutrition, "Tarun Chetna" is also providing pre-school education along with hot milk and biscuits to the Musahar children in Ramaipur Dishini, Kanja, Dhidhui and Ramaipur Newada every day. Tarun Chetna's director Naseem Ansari said that apart from this, ration and dress are also provided to these children free of cost from time to time.



4.3- SETU-Research Project on Health Accessibility :

With the financial support of Azim Premji University and in joint aegis of Tarun Chetna Pratapgarh and Center for Health and Social Justice, New Delhi, a public awareness program is conducting in 15 villages of Patti block of Pratapgarh district under SETU Project regarding the facilities and benefits available through Ayushman Bharat Card and Health and Wellness Center (Ayushman Arogya Mandir), in which efforts are being made by activists to create awareness in the community through various activities.

In the first phase of this research project, the current situation was assessed through interviews with various government and non-government stakeholders and focus group discussions with the community.

In the second phase of this research project, an awareness campaign will be conducted under SETU project. Third phase will be mapping the effect awareness campaign.

1) Training of workers and resource persons:



Training was organized in July-2024, August-2024 and November-2024 for the workers and resource persons working under the Setu project to smoothly implement the project related activities and to share the latest information related to the project and resource persons were trained as per the requirement of the project so

that their services can be taken when required.

2) Personal Interview:

Under the Setu Project, 50 people from the community were interviewed in ten Gram Panchayats of Vikas Khand Patti about the health services available. People gave information about the facilities available at the health centers and the inconveniences faced there. Most of the people said



that in the Patti Government Hospital, the doctors prescribe medicines available

from outside medical stores which are very expensive and also send the patients outside for tests and give the same type of medicines for all the diseases to everyone, due to which we are forced to take medicines from outside.

We found out that the Ayushman Bharat card has been made but we do not know when, where and how it will be useful. Apart from the government, we do not have any list of private hospitals where treatment will be done through the card and there is no information about where and how the card will be renewed.

Regarding Ayushman Arogya Mandir, people said that we do not have any information about it yet and some people said that it has been made but we do not know what facilities and services are available there.

3) Interview of service providers:

Gram Pradhans of Gram Panchayats in the project area talked to the project team. Who were talked to said that the health department does its work regarding health, for which ASHA and ANM have been appointed in the village.

In the same sequence, 24 ASHAs and 02 ANMs and 02 Community Health Officers of ten Gram Panchayats were talked to about their work. During the interview,

these health workers told that we complete the work told to us by the health department. ASHAs told that their work is to prepare the list of pregnant women, get them vaccinated, distribute iron and calcium tablets, make the community aware about non-communicable diseases, etc. ANM told that they have many health related works which



include vaccinating pregnant women and children, checking pregnant women, getting deliveries done, making departmental reports, etc. The Community Health Officer said that screening of communicable and non-communicable diseases at the center, checking blood pressure, sugar and giving medicines available here to the patients and if the patient is in a serious condition or medicines are not available from my level then referring him to the Primary Health Center or Community Health Center and getting him connected to a specialist doctor through telemedicine.

4) Focus Group Discussion:

By conducting focus group discussions in small groups in the community, the facilities available at the health centers in different wards in all the ten gram panchayats and the inconveniences faced there were discussed. During the

discussion, people told that the Patti government hospital is overcrowded and the doctors prescribe all the tests and medicines available from outside medical stores and the medicines available in the hospital are paracetamol, diclofenac, calcium etc. which are the same for all illnesses.

5) Community meeting:

All the fifteen villages covered by the project from awareness meeting, while discussing the eligibility for making, place of making, method of making Ayushman Bharat card, facilities and benefits available through the Ayushman Bharat card, Such senior citizens whose age is seventy years or more are eligible to get Ayushman Bharat card. The medical and health facilities available at the Health and Wellness Center were discussed,

6) Street Play:

People are being made aware about the importance of Ayushman Bharat Card and Health & Wellness Centre and the facilities and benefits available there by staging street plays in all the fifteen Villages covered by the project. Through street plays, that in case of any health-related emergency when you do not have money and do not get any financial help from anywhere, at that time Ayushman Card works as a help for you and your family so that we do not have to take loan from anyone and we also get timely treatment.



7) Awareness rally:

In all the fifteen villages covered by the project, awareness rallies were taken out purva wise with children, women and men, in which people are being made aware about the facilities and benefits available at Ayushman Bharat Card and Health and Wellness Centre. In the rally, people are being made aware about the utility and importance of Ayushman Bharat Card through the slogan “Ayushman Bharat Card Padhaare to every person’s door”. People are being motivated to visit Health and Wellness Centre through the slogan “Hum Sab Ne Thana Hai, Health Wellness Centre Jana Hai”.



4. We organized 1645 women and sensitize them on their rights, issues related to gender, agriculture, climate change, environment, climate-informed farming, etc. through Women Farmers Groups (WFG)
5. Promote climate-informed agriculture practices engaging women farmers.
6. Develop leadership and managerial skills among women in running a business enterprise and gender-sensitive governance.
7. Formed a Farmers Producers Company with 733 women farmers in Pratapgarh district.
8. Sabgharshsheel Mahila Agro FPC have **Farm Machinery Bank**, and start production and marketing of Nutrition Good, Kapila animal feeds, Amala Candy, Jaljeera, Amala Murabba and vermy compost etc.
9. Ensure the participation of women in addressing the family, community and village related issues and the decision- making processes at these levels.
10. Collaborate with PRIs, local administration, government departments and resource agencies in building the capacities of women farmers and also mobilizing the schemes and benefits meant for them.
11. Regular capacity building of CSOs and women farmers through digital platforms.

4.5- Climate Smart Gram Panchayat Development Plan:

In September 2024, under the support and guidance of Vasudha, New Delhi and Dev Act Consultant Pvt. Ltd. Gorakhpur, after understanding the historical timeline, disasters and their effects of Gram Panchayat Saray Jodh Ray, Bahariya- dist.- Prayagraj, an attempt was also made to know with the community as to when disasters have affected this Gram Panchayat.

Climate variability, trends, changes and main factors:

Gram Panchayat Sarai Jodhrai experiences heat, rain and rainfall throughout the year, with droughts common in June and July, while thunderstorms occur from May to August. Heat waves persist from the last week of April to the second week and cold waves from December to January. While three irrigations were sufficient for paddy 15 years ago, now after paddy cultivation, due to lack of irrigation five times, either before or after, dampness continues. A total of 366 houses and 250 families in the Gram Panchayat have their own hand pumps. Out of the 250 hand pumps, all are small hand pumps with number 6, whose water supply has been declared first. In summers, due to the ground water level going down, most hand pumps stop giving water. Out of a total of 38 wells, water from 12 wells is still available for drinking. A lot of labour is required to obtain water from water and the villagers do not have any system to make this water pollution-free.



4.5.1- Creation of environment (Rapport Building)-

With a view to ensuring the participation of the overall public of the Gram Panchayat for the formulation of Climate Smart Gram Panchayat Development Plan for the coming financial years of Gram Panchayat Saray Jodh Ray, Prayagraj, Gram Pradhan Mr. Shubham Jayaswal, with the help of Ward Member Anganwadi, informed door-to-door in the entire Gram Sabha an open meeting has been organized at a public place of the Gram Panchayat.

4.5.2- Open Gram Sabha meeting-

For the formulation of Climate Smart Gram Panchayat Plan for Gram Panchayat Saray Jodh Ray, Prayagraj, an open meeting of the Gram Sabha was organized on 11-09-2024 a Primary School with all the stakeholders as per the pre-determined information. In this open meeting, Gram Pradhan, Ward Member, Self Help Group President, Secretary, Anganwadi Worker, Asha, Headmaster and farmers from 09 Purve, women and men, elderly and all types of respectable persons participated in the open meeting of this Gram Panchayat.

4.5.3- Transect Walk (Village Visit)-

To understand the disaster and risk of the entire Gram Panchayat, before the start of the open meeting, a transect walk of hamlets was conducted with the Gram Pradhan and women of self-help group and people of the Gram Sabha present. During the transect walk, the condition of water logging and dirt was observed. A day after this, a transect walk was also conducted on 9-11 Sept. 2024 in Saroj Basti and Patel Basti to observe the actual situation.

4.5.4- Social Mapping-

After visiting all the mazras, social mapping was prepared in the presence of the villagers in the temple located in the Gram Panchayat, on the basis of which information was obtained.

4.5.5- Preparation of the Climate Smart plan:

After doing all the exercises for preparing the “**Climate Smart Gram Panchayat Development Plan**” a focus group discussion was held with the community to obtain sector-wise information. During this discussion, information was obtained about the current situation in the Gram Panchayat of various points falling under all the 5 sectors, the problems related to it and the action plan for resolving those problems. After the above information, facts and discussions and deliberations with the villagers, Smart Gram



Panchayat Development Plan has been prepared under the concept of Climate Smart Village. In this, detailed information has been collected about disaster, risk, causes of risk and solutions etc. On the basis of which Climate Smart Gram Panchayat Development Plan of Rs. 525.14 lakhs prepared for the Gram Panchayat Saray Jodhray-Prayagraj.

5. Campaign & Awareness-Promoting Awareness for Social Causes:

During the year 2024-25, Tarun Chetna organized many campaign-based program with several stakeholder in Pratapgarh district. Following activities have been conducted throughout the year under this programme.

5.1- International Labor Day: 1st May-2024

Under the Child Rights Project, Tarun Chetna organized a seminar and rally on the occasion of International Labor Day in Bahuta Gram Panchayat. That International Labor Day is celebrated every year on May 1st. The decision to celebrate Labor Day for the first time was taken in 1889. However, it had started in 1886 itself. In view of the temperature, Tarun Chetna appealed to the people to make their villages green by planting trees on their birthdays and on the occasion of marriage.

5.2- Oath to the Vote: 24th May-2024

Patti (Pratapgarh) Under the Sweep program, Tarun Chetna Sanstha today administered the oath to the women of the struggling Mahila Farmers Producer Company in Patti to vote 100 percent. On this occasion, Naseem Ansari, Director of Tarun Chetna, while addressing the farmer women and workers, said that voting is the fundamental responsibility of all. Tomorrow, on 25 May, there is an election festival in Pratapgarh, which is a matter of pride for our country. In this election festival, we all must exercise our right to vote 100 percent. This will strengthen our democracy.



5.3- World No tobacco Day: 31st May-2024

On the occasion of World No Tobacco Day, a program was organized under the Child Rights Project in Bahuta Gram Panchayat of Patti Tehsil. In which

Naseem Ansari, Director of Tarun Chetna, while shedding light on World No Tobacco Day, said that the World Health Organization started celebrating



Tobacco Day in the year 1987. The biggest reason for this was the deaths caused by tobacco consumption at that time. He said that spread love, not smoking, quit tobacco, not life. In the same sequence, Santosh Chaturvedi, while addressing the people, said that the use of tobacco not only hollows out the body but it also

invites a dreadful disease like cancer. Because tobacco consumption is causing many health related diseases, such as cancer, heart disease, liver disease, chronic disease etc. Nicotine in tobacco is a substance that is extremely addictive and is found in tobacco plants. People that choose life, not tobacco because nicotine present in tobacco is highly addictive. A substance called nicotine always attracts the brain.

5.4- International Day Against Child Labour :12th June-2024

On the occasion of International Day Against Child Labor, a child labor awareness ceremony and rally was organized with children in village panchayat Bahuta of Pratapgarh Patti tehsil area under the joint aegis of Tarun Chetna and Anti Human Trafficking Unit (AHTU) Thana Pratapgarh in which children were made aware to stop child labor. In this program, Director of Tarun Chetna, Naseem Ansari, while throwing light on



the objective of the Day Against Child Labor, said that the first World Day Against Child Labor was celebrated on 12 June 2002 by the International Labor Organization (ILO) in Geneva, Switzerland. The headquarters of ILO is in Geneva, Switzerland. Since then, 12 June is celebrated as World Day Against Child Labor across the world. In the same sequence, Anti Human Trafficking Unit Sub Inspector Ramchandra Gupta, while promoting the children, said that child labour is a curse for the civilized society. If a child below 14 years of age or between 14 to 18 years of age is engaged in child labour in any hazardous occupation or process, he can be punished with a prison term of one to six months or a fine of Rs 20,000 to 50,000 or both.

5.5- Weekly celebration of International Girl Child Day:

Patti (Pratapgarh) On the weekly celebration of International Girl Child Day,



Tarun Chetna organized a program on child marriage for the rights of girls in Bhagwati Prasad Girls Inter College Prithviganj Market. Pandit Kalakant Ojha, who is presiding over the program, said that practices like child marriage need to be eradicated from the root, it is a curse for the

civilized society. Light the lamp of education in every home and stop child marriage. Maiswa man Hakim Ansari, while encouraging daughters, said that when a storm comes, day changes to night. When Nari Shakti thunders, history changes. Ansari said that child marriage has a direct impact not only on girls, but also on their family and community. The possibility of dropping out of school increases. The mobility of the daughter remains confined within the four walls. Shyam Shankar Shukla said that 1961, Child Marriage Prohibition Act 2006, Hindu Marriage Act, all these acts have been made to ensure human rights. It is the responsibility of all of us to ensure human rights.

5.6- Mission Shakti Campaign: 08th Oct-2024

Patti (Pratapgarh) On the weekly celebration of International Girl Child Day,

Tarun Chetna organized a program on child marriage regarding the rights of girls in Bhagwati Prasad Balika Inter College Prithviganj Market. Pandit Kalakant Ojha, who is presiding over the program, said that practices like child marriage need to be eradicated from the root, it is a curse for civilized society. Light the lamp of education in every home and stop child marriage. While discussing child marriage, Rajesh Singh,



in-charge of the special juvenile police unit, said that marrying minor children is a curse for our society and we all have to come forward to stop it. Sanjay Yadav, in-charge of the Anti Human Trafficking Unit (AHTU) present at the program, made the students raise their hands and take an oath to not indulge in molestation, child marriage and child labour.

5.7- International Girls Child Day:11th Oct-2024

Patti, Pratapgarh! Under Mission Shakti Phase-5, Tarun Chetna organised a

dialogue on gender discrimination and safety and respect for girls in Government Girls Inter College Patti on the eve of International Girl Child Day, in which girls openly expressed their views through street play. On this occasion, District School Inspector Rajendra Prasad Saroj, who was present as the chief guest, said that education is the key to



awareness, through which our daughters can achieve every success and can even change the thinking of the world. Mr. Saroj advised the daughters to become literate, educated, self-reliant, competent and intelligent. In the same sequence, District Coordinator of Secondary Education Campaign Ranjan Singh said that today daughters are making a name in every field. Daughters should study for their freedom and self-reliance. On this occasion, the director of the organization, Naseem Ansari, while discussing about good touch and bad touch, said that gender-based discrimination starts in our society knowingly or unknowingly from childhood. This discrimination is also due to economic, social and cultural environment. He said that most of us give kitchen sets or dolls to girls to play with. Whereas, we give toys like guns and motor cars to boys. In this way, we instill the idea of gender discrimination in the tender minds of children from the very beginning. Shri Ansari stressed that now the time has come for all of us to oppose gender-based discrimination and inequality, so that daughters and women can also get equal opportunities and environment to live.

5.8- Children's Day: 14th Nov-2024

Patti (Pratapgarh)! Children's Day was organized at pre-school nutrition and education centers by Tarun Chetna Sanstha, in which child rights and their nutrition and cleanliness were discussed with children and parents. On this occasion, Naseem Ansari, Director of Tarun Chetna said that children have mainly four rights, of which the right to live, the right to development, the right to protection and the right to participation are prominent. These rights should not be violated at home or in society under any circumstances, it is the responsibility of all of us to protect their rights. On this occasion, Hakim Ansari said that children are the future of our country and society. It is very important for them to remain healthy and nutritious, because only healthy children will build a safe future. On this occasion, Child Rights Project Coordinator Achhe Lal Bind told the children in detail about the Child Helpline. It is noteworthy that Tarun Chetna is running pre-school nutrition and education centers in 04 poor settlements with the help of Jeev Daya Foundation, in which about 200 children in the age group of 0-6 years in Ramaipur Dishini, Musahar Basti of Dhidhui and Kanja Saraigulami and Jogi Basti of Ramaipur Nevada are being given pre-school education along with a glass of hot milk and biscuits every day. From time to time, these children are given dress, shoes, socks, bags and solar lamps along with ration to the family by the organization. In these centers, from time to time, discussions are held with the parents on the personal hygiene of the children as well as the protection of child rights. The operation of these nutrition centers has reduced malnutrition in many children, due to which a lot of enthusiasm is seen among the children and parents towards the project.



5.9- International Human Rights Day: 10th Dec-2024

Patti, Pratapgarh! On the occasion of International Human Rights Day, a seminar on the right to health was organized in Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar Park of Gram Panchayat Rampur Khagal under the joint aegis of Tarun Chetna and Center for Health and Social Justice. In the seminar, Director of Tarun Chetna, Naseem Ansari said that getting quality health services without

discrimination is the fundamental right of every person, free medical treatment, right to live a safe and healthy life is included under human rights, about the right to health, the World Health Organization says that there can



be no respect, freedom and justice without health for all. In the program, people were made aware about the services available at Health and Wellness Center, Ayushman Bharat Card. Addressing the people in the program, Research Officer of Setu Project Shyam Shankar Shukla said that we have to protect our rights ourselves which have been

given to us by the Constitution. Mr. Shukla said that the Constitution prevents us from discriminating on the basis of color, language, caste, religion, region. At the end of the program, the people present took a pledge in front of the Ambedkar statue that if there is discrimination against anyone anywhere, we will all raise our voice together and protect our rights.

5.10- National Girls Child Day:24th Jan-2025

Tarun Chetna, on the eve of National Girl Child Day, a dialogue was organized with the girls at Azad Bal Vikas Kendra Bahuta on gender discrimination and child marriage and safety and respect, in which the girls also expressed their views openly. On this occasion, Hakim Ansari said that child marriage is a curse for our society. To end practices like child marriage, it is necessary to be aware. Educate daughters well and awaken the society because education is the right of every daughter, now the world should unite for the rights of daughters, education is the key to awareness. With which our daughters can achieve every success



and can even change the thinking of the world. Dr. Achhelal Bind, Coordinator of the Child Rights Project, said that today daughters are making a name in every field. Daughters should study for their freedom and self-reliance. Mr. Bind emphasized that now the time has come for all of us to oppose gender-based discrimination and inequality, so that daughters and women can also get equal opportunities and environment to live.

5.11- Cervical Cancer Awareness Workshop:

Patti (Pratapgarh)! Tarun Chetna Sanstha organized a “Cancer Awareness Workshop” on World Cancer Day today at Ayushman Arogya Mandir Bahuta,

in which as the chief guest, District Program Manager of National Health Mission, Dr. Ranjit Bahadur Yadav said that due to lack of awareness, cancer is taking a horrific form today, on which we have to make people aware. Appreciating the efforts of Tarun Chetna, Dr. Yadav said that according to a report of ICMR, every 8 minutes in India a woman dies of



cervical cancer and to prevent cancer, screening of women above 30 years of age is necessary so that timely diagnosis can be done. We all have to make collective efforts to avoid this disease. On this occasion, Superintendent of Seth Panna Lal Community Health Center, Akhilesh Jaiswal said that today cancer is one of the major causes of death all over the world and in view of its increasing cases, the importance of this day increases even more. The purpose of World Cancer Day is not only to make people aware of this disease, but also to promote combined efforts for its prevention, treatment and prevention. On this occasion, Naseem Ansari, Director of Tarun Chetna said that World Cancer Day is celebrated every year on 4 February in the world and its main objective is to raise awareness about cancer around the world, educate people and unite in the fight against this disease. Mr. Ansari said that not only this, in 2023, the highest number of new cancer cases of 2.10 lakh were registered in Uttar Pradesh, after which the government has directed screening of all women above 30 years of age. Today is an effort by Tarun Chetna in collaboration with Vatsalya and Fawa to support and show solidarity to people affected by cancer and their families.

5.12- Inauguration of Nutrition support product Distribution: 13th Jan-2025

With the support of Dabur India Limited, an Inauguration of Nutrition support product Distribution programme was organized at Tahseel Sabhagar. It is important for children to be aware of their rights but it should be kept in mind that the rights of others should not be violated. the Tehsil Auditorium in collaboration with Dabur India. Praising the organization, Mr. Ahmed said that efforts should be made to include as many



children of weaker sections as possible in this campaign. We hope that this will definitely bring about a change in the society. In the program, Naib Tehsildar Lal Mani praised this initiative of Dabur India. On this occasion, District Legal Services Authority's PLV Ram Prakash Pandey praised Tarun Chetna and said that this will develop

physical and mental energy in children in the coming days. On this occasion, Tarun Chetna's Director Naseem Ansari thanked Dabur India and said that this wonderful partnership will help in fighting malnutrition in Pratapgarh and at the same time, immunity will also be developed in children.

5.13- International Women Day: 08 March-2025

On the occasion of International Women's Day, Give daughters full opportunity to move forward and empower them by educating them. The above thoughts were expressed by Jyoti Savita, Deputy Inspector of Kotwali Patti, as the chief guest on the occasion of International Women's Day organized by Tarun Chetna Sansthan today. Ms. Savita further said that daughters are often left behind in comparison to sons, which creates gender imbalance in the society. She appealed to women to first educate their daughters well, then think about their marriage. She gave information about various helplines related

to the safety of women and children. Prithviganj outpost in-charge Laxmi Kant Sengar, who was present on the occasion, referring to a Sanskrit shloka, said that where women are respected, divine powers also help in the development of the society. This shows the respect given to

They are easily getting positive thinking books and literature locally, which is increasing the feeling of mutual harmony and patriotism among them.
